



## General Information:

Indictable offences are more serious offences that are set out in the *Criminal Code* of Canada. They generally include sentences six months of imprisonment and more (can be up to life imprisonment) or punishment by way of ticket or fine of \$2,000 and over.

Persons serving sentences, including parole, temporary leave or absence (day pass), or another form of conditional release (Full Parole or Statutory Release) are generally restricted from travel outside Canada under the *Corrections and Conditional Release Act* and its regulations.

Once persons have completed their sentences, they are no longer under travel restrictions unless:

- there are other outstanding criminal charges for an indictable offence

OR

- they are under a court order which includes travel restrictions, such as a Long Term Supervision Order.
